Two Wesleyan Seniors Named National Merit Hispanic Scholars

We are most pleased to announce that *Mary Hardin* and *Kevin Ruiz* have been selected as Scholars in the National Hispanic Recognition Program. According to the National Merit Scholarship Corporation, each of these students “shows exceptional academic ability and potential for success in rigorous college studies.” The National Hispanic Recognition Program, established in 1983, is a College Board program that provides national recognition of the outstanding achievements of Hispanic high school seniors and identifies them for postsecondary institutions.

Students enter the program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) as high school juniors. This year, more than 175,000 students competed for this honor; only 4,700 of them have been recognized as National Hispanic Scholars or Honorable Mention Finalists. Both *Mary* and *Kevin* have been recognized as National Scholars.
