

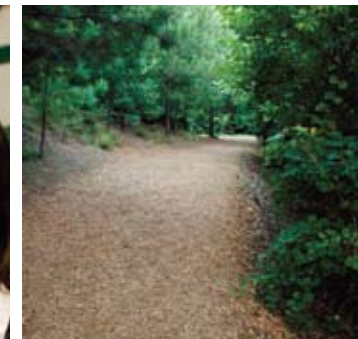

MISSION

Wesleyan's mission is to be a Christian school of academic excellence by providing each student a diverse college preparatory education guided by Christian principles and beliefs; by challenging and nurturing the mind, body, and spirit; and by developing responsible stewardship in our changing world.

SETTING

Wesleyan is located on a wooded, 83-acre campus in Norcross, a northeast suburb of Atlanta. Wesleyan's beautiful campus has a unique, residential feel. Through the support of parents and donors, many buildings have been constructed in a relatively short time. The Wesleyan campus consists of nine buildings, 83 classrooms, three chapels, two libraries, one language lab, six computer labs, two state-of-the-art theaters including a black box theater, four gyms, five basketball courts, seven tennis courts, a 3,000 seat stadium with a synthetic running track, and a ten-lane natatorium with a diving well. A beautifully landscaped central mall, a lake, and cross country trails complete the space.






Our COMMUNITY

- Full-time counselors in each division

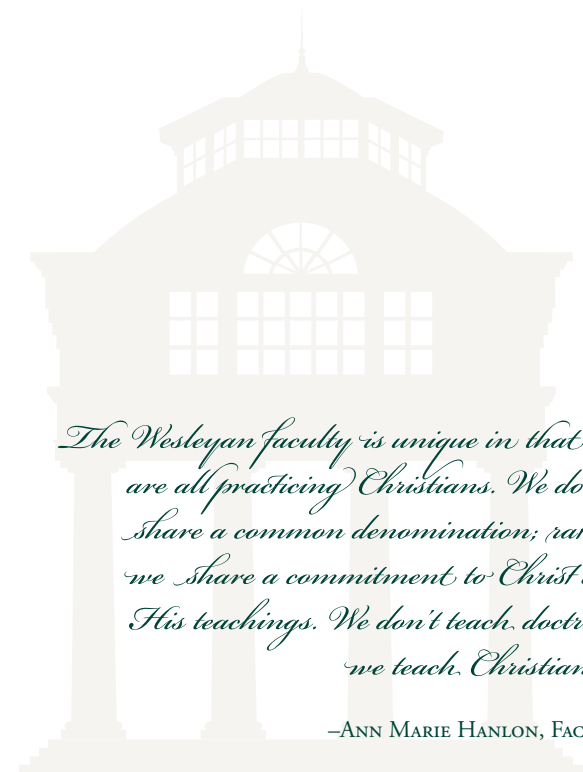


Our FAITH
