

ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF ATLANTA—This project is a **Peer-Leadership Group Project**. *2 projects*: Half of the students will be sorting clothes for Thrift Store while the other half of students will be bagging new clothes &/or healthcare kits for Operation School Bell. Chaperones: Linda McDaniel & Anne Shirley.

ATLANTA COMMUNITY FOOD BANK COMMUNITY GARDENS—This project is a **Peer-Leadership Group Project**. **Two Peer Groups and their leaders will be assigned this project**. Students will be working in the Community Gardens of ACFB, which provides neighborhoods with fresh vegetables, beautiful land and a place to meet and work towards positive goals. Students may be asked to do some planting, seeding, weeding, turning the soil, building new beds, and moving materials. Chaperones: Andy Free, Sabrina Schulze & Kevin Kadzis.

ATLANTA COMMUNITY TOOL BANK—Students will be working in the warehouse sorting donations and other supplies/tools. Chaperones: Steve Broyles & Brian Krehmeyer.

ATLANTA MISSION MY SISTER'S HOUSE—(*3 projects*) (1) 7 students will be working in the clothing closet sorting donations. (2) 7 students will be assisting with meal preparation. (3) 6 students will be working in one of three classrooms: infant, toddler, or pre-K classrooms. Chaperones: Suzanne Ragains, Meagan Brooker & Matthew Means.

ATLANTA MISSION SHEPHERD'S INN—*2 male* chaperones and *10 male* students will be preparing lunch (400 sandwiches, chips, and drinks that Serve His League will be providing), as well as sorting clothes, helping with any donations that may come in on that day, and also assisting with general maintenance and cleaning of the facility. BUILD AN ARK ANIMAL RESCUE— Science NHS students were given the opportunity to sign up for this project first. Any remaining spots are open to any upper classman who would like to serve on this project. 10 students will be working directly with the animals at Build An Ark Animal Rescue. The other 10 students will be building a fence and doing other maintenance related repairs around the grounds/facility. Chaperones: Dr. Skipper Gholston, Pam Fedas & Leslie Grogan.

CHATTAHOOCHEE NATURE CENTER—Students will be assisting the Operations Department Staff with pulling privet, mulching trails, clearing back area of one of the trails at the center and/or helping with the gardens, etc. Need 2 chaperones for 15 students. CHILDREN'S RESTORATION NETWORK—Students will be assisting with a mass mailing. Students will be folding, taping and labeling 7,500 CRN Newsletters for distribution to their constituents. Chaperone: Joseph Cooper.

CITY OF REFUGE—(2 projects) One group will be working with Compassion Atlanta, the food distribution warehouse of City of Refuge. Students will be helping prepare food boxes that will be distributed to those in need in the community. Another group of students will be sorting clothing donations. EAGLE RANCH—Students will be spreading mulch around the boys and girls playground fall zone along with some other outdoor related clean-up/maintenance related projects. Students and chaperones need to bring gloves and wear clothes and shoes that they won't mind getting dirty. Chaperone: Tim Blue.

EAST LAKE ARBOR HEALTH & REHAB NURSING HOME—**This project is a Peer-Leadership Group Project.** Students will be interacting with the residents playing board games, doing arts & crafts, painting nails, etc. Chaperones: Cary Marquell & Jonathan Koch.

FOSTER CARE SUPPORT FOUNDATION—**This project is a Peer-Leadership Group Project.** Students will be split into two groups and will be working at 2 different locations. One group made up of all girls and 3 freshman boys will be working at Fostering Hope Bargain Resale, a newly opened Thrift Store of FCSF, where they will be sorting and organizing donations. The other group made up of the male senior peer leader and 3 freshman boys will be working at Foster Care Support Foundation. Chaperones: Nina Kozlova & Corrie Nash.

FOUNDATION FOR HOSPITAL ART—10 art students will be painting/touching-up canvases. Chaperone: Theresa Mays-Albanese.

FURNITURE BANK OF METRO ATLANTA—Students will be assisting clients with selecting and loading their furniture. The Furniture Bank schedules 10 families to come to the warehouse and shop. After the client appointments, students will sort and organize the furniture in the warehouse. Chaperone: Jack Van de Sluys.

GLOBAL SOAP PROJECT—Students will be working in the warehouse cleaning slightly used bars of soap, sorting soap, breaking down, melting and forming new bars, and cutting new bars for distribution to vulnerable populations. Chaperones: Caroline Antonio & Adrienne Christian.

GOOD SAMARITAN HEALTH CARE—**This project is a Peer-Leadership Group Project.** Students will be assisting the clinic with administrative duties and may be asked to call patients for appointments, file paperwork, sort health packets, assemble information folders, sort charts, sort prescription and non-prescription medication and/or do some general maintenance and cleaning of the facility. THE LIONHEART SCHOOL—This project is a Senior Project. The Lionheart School is for children with autism and other disorders of relating and communicating who need a specialized learning environment. 19 senior boys & 6 senior girls will be assisting with Field Day. Some students will be running various games and activities for Field Day, while others will serve as “buddies” for Lionheart students as they move from one activity to the next. An additional 4 seniors (2 senior boys & 2 senior girls) will be working in the lower grade classrooms where they will be providing aid to teachers and students with various classroom activities. NORCROSS COMMUNITY GARDEN— Students will be working in the Community Gardens of Norcross, which provides neighborhoods with fresh vegetables, beautiful land and a place to meet and work towards positive goals. Students will be removing weeds and invasive plants, repositioning some beds, installing hoops and covers on 2 beds for winter growing, planting winter and cover crops, mulching, watering, etc. Chaperones: Amanda Lang & Gabi Martinez-Esteve.

NORCROSS COOPERATIVE MINISTRY—Students will be sorting and shelving food drive donations from our HS, MS and LS October food drive and also sorting clothing donations. Students may also be given the opportunity to play with toddlers and do VBS activities with them while parents are being interviewed by agency for assistance, a process which takes 2-3 hours to complete. NORTH FULTON CHILD DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION—This project is a Peer-Leadership Group Project. Students will be paired up to work in one of seven daycare center classrooms. Each class will be working on an arts and craft activity, which the daycare has planned and organized. Chaperones: Mike Jones & Kari Young.

NORTH FULTON COMMUNITY CHARITIES—This project is a Peer-Leadership Group Project. Students will be sorting food in the Food Pantry, sorting clothing and household donations in the Thrift Shop, helping with administrative work, &/or assisting with their holiday program setting up Christmas trees, etc. Chaperones: Jan Azar & Ashley Stainback.

PROJECT OPEN HAND—Students will be preparing lunches for terminal ill and elderly patients. There will be dress code requirements for this project in order to meet health code regulations. Chaperones: Colleen Walker & Annette Smith.

ROSEMONT AT STONE MOUNTAIN NURSING HOME—Students will be interacting with the residents. 6 female students, with the assistance of employees from the nursing home, will be pampering the female residents with a “Nail Day” doing hand massages and painting finger nails. After nails, students will play games with the residents (i.e. checkers, cards, bingo, etc.). 6 male students will be joining the Men’s Group for fun & games. SHELTERING ARMS DAYCARE, NORCROSS—This project is a **Peer-Leadership Group Project**. Students will be paired up to work in one of seven daycare center classrooms to work with the teacher(s) and children. Chaperone: Heidi Lloyd.
