

Clark Walker – Class of 2001

Honors & Involvement at Wesleyan

- Member of the football, basketball & track teams
- 4 year starter and first male basketball player to score 1,000 points & currently 4th all time leading scorer with 1,582 points
- 6th all time single season scoring with 515 pts. (1st to average over 20 pts. a game at 22.4)
- 3rd all time in career assists with 285
- 4th all time in career steals with 168
- 2nd all time in career 3 pointers made with 148
- 3rd all time in single season 3 pt. percentage, making over 40% in the 2000-01 season
- Scored 1st touchdown in Wesleyan football history in the first Wesleyan football game on the opening kickoff, leading that team to a winning record in the inaugural season
- All County player in 2001
- 2001 Most Valuable Senior Male Athlete

- Clark co-founded the East Coast Basketball League (teams in North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland & Delaware) while at the University of Virginia.
- Clark still manages the league he started as well as coaches the UVA team in the league.

“Clark Walker caught a touchdown pass in the first varsity home game, which was also the first win for the varsity football team. That win took place on the night Henderson Stadium and Robinson Field were dedicated. In his senior season of 2000, Clark led the football team to a 6-0 start, which was the record for consecutive wins until 2008. That season also led to the football team's first top ten ranking in school history. Clark tore his ACL his senior year and opted to not have surgery so that he could play basketball during his senior season where he started at point guard and averaged 22.4 points a game to finish his career as the first Wesleyan boy to score over 1,000 points. Clark's commitment to Wesleyan during his 4 years as a varsity athlete established a high standard for our students to follow.” –Jan Azar
